SECURITY COUNTY OF DAWSON 8

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

THAT THIS IS EVIDENCE IN WRITING of an agreement this day entered into by and between the CITY OF LAMESA, a municipal corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Texas, hereinafter called "City", and the LAMESA INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, hereinafter called "School District".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the School District, in cooperation with the City, join together in this agreement to provide a safe, orderly environment free from the temptation and threat of drugs and violence; and

WHEREAS, the School District seeks assistance from law enforcement authorities to monitor and prevent unlawful drugs and drug related activity; and

WHEREAS, the School District recognizes the value of the presence of uniformed peace officers at each campus; and

WHEREAS, Section 37.081(a) of the Education Code provides that the governing board of any school district may employ security personnel for use in any school within its district when the board in its discretion determines that the personnel are necessary; and

WHEREAS, the School District and the City would like to employ the services of four full-time peace officers for said purposes; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the public health and welfare of the people of the respective jurisdiction s to have such security services available in the schools of this community.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City and School District, acting herein by and through their respective governing bodies, agree as follows:

1.

As used in this agreement:

- (a) "Police Department" shall be the police department of the City of Lamesa, Texas.
- (b) "Peace officer" shall be a commissioned police officer of the Lamesa Police Department but employed by the Lamesa Independent School District to be assigned as a Student Resource Officer.
- (c) "Security services" shall be the services performed by the peace officers and by the police department of the City, on behalf of the School District, as set forth in this agreement.

2.

The city agrees to commission two peace officers to perform such duties as are allowed by a school district peace officer under Chapter 37 of the Education Code; to perform administrative and law enforcement duties for the School District as determined by the board of trustees; and to protect the safety and welfare of any person in the jurisdiction of the peace officers and the property, both real and personal, of the School District.

The City agrees to make available to the School District said peace officers on the terms and conditions hereinafter set out:

- (a) the peace officers will be and shall remain employees of the School District, and shall work under the direction of the Police Department while performing the duties involving criminal matters under this agreement;
- (b) selection of the peace officers to provide said security services will be by mutual consent of the School District and the City. The peace officers will meet the employment standards of the City, the State certification standards for peace officers, and any additional professional, educational or certification standards as may be required by the School District.
- (c) the peace officers will abide by the School District's and the Police Department's rules and regulations;
- (d) the peace officers will attend staff development education and training programs and activities as deemed necessary by the School District and the City subject to other limitations contained in this agreement;
- the peace officers will be responsible for presenting educational programs on drug education when requested by the School District;
- (f) the peace officers will visit all campuses of the School District on a regular basis;
- (g) the peace officers shall inform the Police Department of any criminal activity and/or investigations that occur in the School District. The peace officers will enter call sheets and reports into the Police Department records management system during the course of their daily duties;
- (h) it is understood that the peace officers have the powers, privileges, and immunities of a peace officer; and that said officers may enforce all laws, including municipal ordinances and state laws within the School District's boundaries; and may, in accordance with Chapter 52.01(a), Family Code, take a juvenile into custody;
- the peace officers may provide assistance to the Police Department or to another law enforcement agency if requested by the Police Department or other law enforcement agency; and
- (j) the City Manager of the City and the Superintendent of the School District may enter into a memorandum of understanding that outlines reasonable communication and coordination efforts to effect the provision of such security services provided in this agreement; and it is understood that said memorandum shall be incorporated by reference as part of this agreement.

The term of this agreement shall commence on July23, 2019, or upon approval of this agreement by both parties and selection of the designation officers, and shall automatically terminate as 12 midnight on July 22, 2020, with no further notice to either party hereto required.

5.

The School District agrees to pay to the City the sum of \$5,500.00 upon execution of this agreement to assist in the cost of, and to allow access by the peace officers, to the records management system used by the Police Department.

6.

It is expressly understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the security services hereinabove provided shall not include the provision of additional peace officers for security services at events sponsored or conducted by the School District. Such security services requiring additional personnel shall be provided at a compensation rate set by the City.

It is agreed that the School District and the City each shall maintain liability insurance that will cover any claim, cause of action, or suit mage to the maximum limits under the Texas Tort Claims Act as it now exists and as it may be amended from time to time.

R

It is expressly understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the operation of the Police Department, its equipm d personnel, and the manner of its operation shall at all times be under the discretion of the City.

9.

It is specifically understood that any dispute over technical or policy issues relating to the terms of this agreement that may occur during rm of this agreement, shall be resolved by mutual consent of the City Manager of the City and the Superintendent of the School District. Any s solution shall be committed to written form, distributed to the City Council of the City and the School Board of the School District, and included attachment to this agreement.

10.

Notwithstanding any other provision herein regarding the term of this agreement, either party hereto shall have the right to terminate eement upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. In the event of such termination, neither party hereto shall have any fur ligation hereunder.

11.

It is specifically understood that in the event that any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this agreement is, for any reason, h be invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this agreement.

12.

The provisions of the agreement are to be cumulative and all other contracts, agreements, or parts of contracts or agreements, whet itten or oral, governing or regulating the same subject matter as that covered herein are hereby expressly repealed.

13

This agreement contains the entire agreement. There are no other agreements, oral or written, and the terms of this agreement can be amend by by written agreement signed and ratified by both parties or as otherwise provided herein.
