WHEREAS, the City of Lamesa, Texas (the "City") has entered into that certain Agreement for the Purchase and Acquisition of Conjunctive Use Groundwater Supply (the "Agreement") entered into as of May 15, 1996, as amended, with the Canadian River Municipal Water Authority (the "Authority"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority has entered similar agreements with each of the other cities that are members of the Authority (the "Member Cities"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority issued and has outstanding its Canadian River Municipal Water Authority Subordinate Lien Contract Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2012 (Conjunctive Use Groundwater Supply Project); Canadian River Municipal Water Authority Subordinate Lien Contract Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2014 (Conjunctive Use Groundwater Supply Project); Canadian River Municipal Water Authority Subordinate Lien Contract Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2017 (Conjunctive Use Groundwater Supply Project); and Canadian River Municipal Water Authority Subordinate Lien Contract Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2020 (Conjunctive Use Groundwater Supply Project); and

WHEREAS, at the present time the Authority desires to issue refunding bonds to refund all or a part of the outstanding Canadian River Municipal Water Authority Subordinate Lien Contract Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2012 (Conjunctive Use Groundwater Supply Project) (the "Series 2012 Bonds") if market conditions justify refunding all, or a part of, the Series 2012 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement provides for certain notice requirements before the Authority may issue Additional Bonds, as defined in the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the refunding bonds are Additional Bonds under the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, timing constraints in the meeting schedules of the governing bodies of all Member Cities of the Authority to consider and approve refunding bonds may prevent the Authority from issuing refunding bonds in a timely manner to provide savings to the Member Cities; and

WHEREAS, if the market is such that the Series 2012 Bonds can be refunded, it is in the best interest of the City to waive certain notice requirements under the Agreement and consent to the issuance of the bonds to permit the Authority to refund all or a part of

the outstanding Series 2012 Bonds if a present value savings of at least 5.00% can be achieved; and

WHEREAS, if the market conditions justify the refunding of the Series 2012 Bonds, then the Authority desires to issue refunding bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$21,000,000 to refund all or a part of the outstanding Series 2012 Bonds; and

WHEREAS the City agrees to the Authority's issuance of bonds as subordinate lien bonds to eliminate the need of a reserve fund;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAMESA, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Should market conditions during calendar year 2021 justify the refunding of the Series 2012 Bonds, the City waives the notice requirements of Section 4.1(a) of the Agreement, and consents to the issuance of the Canadian River Municipal Water Authority Subordinate Lien Contract Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2021 in a principal amount not to exceed \$21,000,000 to refund all or a part of the outstanding Series 2012 Bonds, subject to the requirement that the refunding bonds for the Series 2012 Bonds provide a present value debt service savings of at least 5.00%.

SECTION 2. That the City Secretary be and is hereby authorized to deliver certified copies of this Resolution and minutes pertaining to its adoption to the Authority in such numbers as may be requested for the Authority's records and proceedings.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR E9-1-1 PUBLIC SAFETY ANSWERING POINT SERVICES

Article 1: Parties & Purpose

1.1 The **PERMIAN BASIN REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION** (RPC) is a regional planning commission and political subdivision of the State of Texas organized and operating under the Texas Regional Planning Act of 1965, as amended, Chapter 391 of the Local Government Code. The RPC has developed a Strategic Plan to establish and operate 9-1-1 service (Strategic Plan) in State Planning Region **9** (Region), and the Commission on State Emergency Communications (Commission) has approved its current Strategic Plan.

1.2 **CITY OF LAMESA** (Local Government) is a local government that operates Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP) that assist in implementing the Strategic Plan as approved by the Commission.

1.3 The Commission, as authorized by Health & Safety Code, Chapter 771, is the oversight and funding authority for regional planning commissions implementing 9-1-1 service.

1.4 The Contract for 9-1-1 Services between the Commission and the RPC requires the RPC to execute interlocal agreements with local governments relating to the planning, development, operation, and provision of 9-1-1 service, the use of wireline and wireless 9-1-1 fees and equalization surcharge appropriated to the Commission and granted to the RPC (9-1-1 Funds) and adherence to Applicable Law. *"9-1-1 service" as defined by the Texas Health & Safety Code, Chapter 771, means a communications service that connects users to a public safety answering point through a 9-1-1 system.*

Article 2: Applicable Law

2.1 Applicable laws include, but are not limited to, the Texas Health and Safety Code Chapter 771; Commission Rules (Title 1, Part 12, Texas Administrative Code) and Program Policy Statements; the biennial state General Appropriations Act, Texas Government Code (including Uniform Grant and Contract Management Standards [UGMS]), Chapter 783 and Title 1, Part 1, Chapter 5, Subchapter A, Division 4, Texas Administrative Code; Preservation and Management of Local Government Records Act, Chapter 441, Subchapter J; and Resolution of Certain Contract Claims Against the State, Chapter 2260); Texas Local Government Code (including Regional Planning Commissions Act, Chapter 391).

2.2 Any new or amended policy or procedure, other than an adopted rule, shall be enforceable against the Local Government 30 days following the date of its adoption unless the RPC finds and declares that an emergency exists which requires that such policy or procedure be enforceable immediately. The RPC shall provide the Local Government written notice of all new or amended policies, procedures or interpretations of Commission rules within a reasonable time after adoption, and in any event at least

10 days prior to the time such policies or procedures are enforceable against the Local Government.

Article 3: Deliverables

3.1 The Local Government agrees to:

3.1.1 Operate and maintain the Lamesa Police Department PSAP(s) located at, 601 S 1st St, Lamesa, TX 79331

3.1.2 Provide 9-1-1 public safety answering service 24 hours per day, seven days per week; and

3.1.3 Cooperate with the RPC in providing and maintaining suitable PSAP space meeting all technical requirements.

3.2 Ownership, Transference & Disposition of Equipment

3.2.1. The RPC and the Local Government shall comply with Applicable Law, in regards to the ownership, transfer of ownership, and/or control of equipment acquired with 9-1-1 Funds in connection with the provision of 9-1-1 service (9-1-1 equipment).

3.2.2 The RPC shall establish ownership of all 9-1-1 equipment located within the Local Government's jurisdiction. The RPC may maintain ownership, or it may agree to transfer ownership to the Local Government according to established policy.

3.2.3 The Local Government shall ensure that sufficient controls and security exist by which to protect and safeguard the 9-1-1 equipment against loss, damage or theft.

3.2.4 Ownership and transfer-of-ownership documents shall be prepared by the RPC and signed by both parties upon establishing ownership or transference of ownership of any such 9-1-1 equipment in accordance with UGMS and the State Comptroller of Public Accounts. Sample forms are provided as Attachments A and B to this Agreement.

3.2.5 Replacement insurance on 9-1-1 equipment shall be purchased and maintained by Permian Basin Regional Planning Commission and proof of insurance shall be provided upon request.

3.2.6 The RPC and/or the Commission shall be reimbursed by the Local Government for any damage to 9-1-1 equipment other than ordinary wear and tear.

3.3 Inventory

3.3.1 The RPC shall maintain a current inventory of all 9-1-1 equipment consistent with Applicable Law;

3.3.2 All 9-1-1 equipment shall be tagged with identification labels.

3.3.3 Any lost or stolen 9-1-1 equipment shall be reported to the RPC as soon as possible.

3.4 Security

3.4.1 The Local Government shall limit access to all 9-1-1 equipment and related data only to authorized personnel.

3.5 Training

3.5.1 The Local Government shall notify the RPC of any new 9-1-1 call takers and schedule for applicable training as soon as possible.

3.6 Operations

The Local Government shall:

3.6.1 Designate a PSAP supervisor and provide related contact information to the RPC;

3.6.2 Monitor and test the 9-1-1 equipment and report any failures or maintenance issues immediately to the appropriate maintenance vendor and/or the RPC;

3.6.3 Coordinate with the RPC and local elected officials in the planning for and implementation and operation of all 9-1-1 equipment;

3.6.4 Allow 24-hour access to the 9-1-1 equipment for repair and maintenance service, as required;

3.6.5 Assist the RPC in conducting inspections of all 9-1-1 equipment at the PSAP as identified by the RPC for quality assurance;

3.6.6 Test all Telecommunications Devices for the Deaf (TDD) for proper operation;

3.6.7 Log all TDD 9-1-1 calls and equipment testing as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990;

3.6.8 Log all trouble reports and make copies available to the RPC as required by the RPC;

3.6.9 Make no changes to 9-1-1 equipment, software or programs without prior written consent from the RPC.

Article 4: Performance Monitoring

4.1 The RPC and the Commission reserve the right to perform on-site monitoring of the PSAP(s) for compliance with Applicable Law and performance of the deliverables specified in this Agreement. The Local Government agrees to fully cooperate with all monitoring requests from the RPC and/or the Commission for such purposes.

Article 5: Procurement

5.1 The RPC and the Local Government agree to use competitive procurement practices and procedures required by Applicable Law and RPC procurement policies in connection with any procurement to be funded with 9-1-1 Funds.

5.2 The RPC shall purchase or reimburse Local Government for supplies necessary for performance of the deliverables per this Agreement. In some instances, the RPC will actually purchase some supplies and reimburse others.

Article 6: Financial

6.1 As authorized by Applicable Law, the provisioning of 9-1-1 service throughout the Region is funded by Commission grants of appropriated 9-1-1 Funds.

6.2 The RPC will provide 9-1-1 Funds to the Local Government on a cost reimbursement basis using a monitoring process that provides assurance that the reimbursement requests from the Local Government are complete, accurate, authorized and appropriate.

6.3 The RPC may withhold, decrease, or seek reimbursement of 9-1-1 Funds in the event that those 9-1-1 Funds were used in noncompliance with Applicable Law.

6.4 The Local Government shall reimburse the RPC and/or the Commission, as applicable, any 9-1-1 Funds used in noncompliance with Applicable Law.

6.5 Such reimbursement of 9-1-1 Funds to the RPC and/or the Commission, as applicable, shall be made by the Local Government within 60 days after demand by the RPC, unless an alternative repayment plan is approved by the RPC and then submitted to the Commission for approval.

6.6 The Local Government commits to providing 9-1-1 services as a condition to receiving 9-1-1 Funds as prescribed by the RPC's Strategic Plan and any amendments thereto.

Article 7: Records

7.1 The Local Government will maintain adequate fiscal records and supporting documentation of all 9-1-1 Funds reimbursed to the Local Government for 9-1-1 service consistent with Applicable Law and generally accepted accounting principles and as approved in the RPC's current approved Strategic Plan;

7.2 The RPC or its duly authorized representative shall have access to and the right to examine and audit all books, accounts, records, files, and/or other papers or property pertaining to the 9-1-1 service belonging to or in use by the Local Government, the PSAP, or by any other entity that has performed or will perform services related to this Agreement.

7.3 The Commission and State Auditor's Office shall have the same access and examination rights as the RPC.

Article 8: Assignment

8.1 The Local Government may not assign its rights or subcontract its duties under this Agreement. An attempted assignment or subcontract in violation of this paragraph is void.

Article 9: Nondiscrimination and Equal Opportunity

9.1 The RPC and the Local Government shall not exclude anyone from participating under this Agreement, deny anyone benefits under this Agreement, or otherwise unlawfully discriminate against anyone in carrying out this Agreement because of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability, handicap, or national origin.

Article 10: Dispute Resolution

10.1 Disputes include, but are not limited to, disagreement between the parties about the meaning or application of the Strategic Plan, the Applicable Law or policy, or this Agreement.

10.2 The parties desire to resolve disputes without litigation. Accordingly, if a dispute arises, the parties agree to attempt in good faith to resolve the dispute between them. To this end, the parties agree not to sue one another, except to enforce compliance with this Article 10, until they have exhausted the procedures set out in this Article 10.

10.3 At the written request of either party, each party shall appoint one non-lawyer representative to negotiate informally and in good faith to resolve any dispute arising between the parties. The representatives appointed shall determine the location, format, frequency, and duration of the negotiations.

10.4 If the representatives cannot resolve the dispute within 30 calendar days after the first negotiation meeting, the parties agree to submit the dispute to a mutually designated legal mediator. Each party shall pay one-half the total fee and expenses for conducting the mediation.

10.5 The parties agree to continue performing their duties under this Agreement, which are unaffected by the dispute, during the negotiation and mediation process.

10.6 If mediation does not resolve the parties' dispute, the parties may pursue their legal and equitable remedies.

Article 11: Suspension for Unavailability of Funds

11.1 In the event that (i) the RPC's approved budget and/or appropriations to the Commission from the Texas Legislature do not permit or otherwise appropriate funds for reimbursement to Local Government provided for in this Agreement, and (ii) such lack of permission or non-appropriation shall not have resulted from any act or failure to act on the part of the RPC, and (iii) the RPC has exhausted all funds legally available for reimbursement to Local Government, and no other legal procedure shall exist whereby payment hereunder can be made to Local Government; and (iv) RPC has negotiated in good faith with Local Government to develop an alternative payment schedule or new agreement that will accommodate RPC's approved budget and/or appropriations for the applicable period, then RPC will not be obligated to reimburse the Local Government for the applicable budget year(s).

Article 12: Notice to Parties

12.1 Notice under this Agreement must be in writing and received by the party against whom it is to operate. Notice is received by a party (1) when it is delivered to the party personally; or (2) on the date shown on the return receipt if mailed by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the party's address specified in this Article and signed on behalf of the party.

12.2 The RPC's address is:

12.3 A party may change its address by providing notice of the change in accordance with paragraph 12.1.

Article 13: Effective Date and Term

13.1 This Agreement is effective as of September 1, 2021 and shall terminate on August 31, 2023.

13.2 In the event of default in the performance of this Agreement, the non-defaulting party may terminate this Agreement after providing written notice of the default to the defaulting party, and the failure of the defaulting party to cure said default within 30 calendar days of said notice.

13.3 If this Agreement is terminated for any reason, the RPC shall not be liable to the Local Government for any damages, claims, losses, or any other amounts arising from or related to any such termination.

Article 14: Force Majeure

14.1 The RPC may grant relief from performance of the Agreement if the Local Government is prevented from performance by act of war, order of legal authority, act of God, or other unavoidable cause not attributable to the fault or negligence of the Local Government. The burden of proof for the need of such relief shall rest upon the Local Government. To obtain release based on force majeure, the Local Government shall file a written request with the RPC.

Article 15: Confidentiality

15.1 The parties will comply with the Texas Public Information Act, Government Code, Chapter 552 as interpreted by judicial opinions and opinions of the Attorney General of the State of Texas. This Agreement and all data and other information generated or otherwise obtained in its performance may be subject to the Texas Public Information Act. The parties agree to maintain the confidentiality of information received during the performance of this Agreement.

15.2 The Local Government or its duly authorized representative will notify the RPC upon receipt of any requests for information.

Article 16: Indemnification

16.1 To the extent authorized by law, each party agrees to indemnify the other and agrees to defend its governing body members, officers and employees, against any claim, suit or administrative proceeding, and to indemnify them against any liability including all costs, expenses, and reasonable attorney's fees incurred arising out of an act or omission of the governing body, any officer, employee or agent in carrying out this Agreement.

Article 17. Historically Underutilized Business Requirements

17.1 The Local Government shall comply with requirements of Chapter 2261 of the Government Code regarding Historically Underutilized Businesses.

Article 18: Miscellaneous

18.1 For purposes of this Agreement, terms not specifically defined herein are defined in the Applicable Laws.

18.2 Each individual signing this Agreement on behalf of a party warrants that he or she is legally authorized to do so, and that the party is legally authorized to perform the obligations undertaken.

18.3 This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any and all oral or written agreements between the parties relating to matters herein. An amendment to this Agreement is not effective unless in writing and signed by both parties.

18.4 All parties agree that should any provision of this Agreement be determined to be invalid or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the term of this Agreement, which shall continue in full force and effect.

Attachment C

PSAP - Scope of Work

Protect the 9-1-1 equipment and secure the premises of its PSAPs against unauthorized entrance or use.

Operate within standard procedures, as established by RPC, and take appropriate security measures as may be necessary, to ensure that non-CSEC approved third-party software applications cannot be integrated into the PSAP Customer Premise Equipment (CPE) / Integrated Workstations, as outlined in CSEC Rule 251.07, *Guidelines for Implementing Integrated Services*.

Adhere to Health & Safety Code, Section 771.061, Confidentiality of Information, in maintaining 9-1-1 and addressing databases.

Practice preventive maintenance of the 9-1-1 equipment, software, and databases, including, at a minimum, backing up data biweekly on a removable medium and storing the removable medium in a secure place.

Upgrade its 9-1-1 equipment and software, as authorized in the current Plan, by requesting RPC to purchase on its behalf new equipment and/or software.

In instances of damage to any equipment purchased with 9-1-1 funds due to intentional misconduct, abuse, misuse or negligence by Local Government employees, Local Government agrees to reimburse RPC for the cost of replacing and/or repairing said equipment. Equipment should be kept clean and dust free.

Purchase supplies necessary for the continuous operation of its 9-1-1 CPE, and Ancillary equipment, as outlined in the approved RPC Strategic Plan, and in compliance with proper procurement procedures.

Provide calltakers/dispatchers access to emergency communications training as approved in the strategic plan, or as determined by the local government.

Notify RPC of any new 9-1-1 calltakers/dispatchers and schedule for training as soon as possible. If Local Government chooses to train its own personnel, the Local Government must certify in writing to the RPC that the 9-1-1 calltaker/dispatcher has been trained prior to using the equipment funded by 9-1-1 fees.

Designate a PSAP Coordinator/Supervisor and provide related contact information as a single point of contact for RPC.

Coordinate with RPC and local elected officials in the planning for, implementation and operation of, all 9-1-1 equipment.

Monitor the 9-1-1 calltakers and equipment and report any failures or maintenance issues to the appropriate Telco and RPC.

Keep a log of all trouble reports and make copies available to RPC as needed.

Notify RPC of any and all major service-affecting issues or issues needing escalation within a service provider's organization.

Test all 9-1-1 CPE and Ancillary equipment for proper operation and user familiarity at least once per month. Testing should include 9-1-1 test calls, placed from a wireline and wireless telephone, including at a minimum:

- * 9-1-1 call- voice, ANI/ALI verification, instant playback recording,
- * Speed dial transfer
- * Abandoned call
- * TTY call (standalone & CPE)
- * Call overflow
- * 9-1-1 printer
- * Ancillary equipment functionality
- * Text to 9-1-1

Test 9-1-1 Telecommunications Devices for the Deaf (TTY) for proper operation and to maintain user familiarity at least once per month.

Log all TTY calls, as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and submit copies of the logs to the RPC on an as-needed basis.

Limit access to all 9-1-1 CPE equipment and related data only to authorized public safety personnel.

Make no changes to 9-1-1 CPE equipment, software, or programs without prior written consent from RPC.

Provide a safe and healthy environment for all 9-1-1 calltakers/dispatchers which enhances proper use and maintenance of 9-1-1 equipment.

Attachment D

PSAP Operations Performance Measures and Monitoring

Reports

The RPC may request that the Local Government provide it with specialized reports which will not duplicate information readily available from vendors. Such reports shall include, but are not limited to:

Monthly PSAP Equipment Checklist

Logs

The Local Government shall provide copies of logs and reports to assist with the RPC's collection of efficiency data on the operation of PSAPs including, but not limited to:

1. PSAP Monitoring Checklist at least twice per year during site visits ;
2. List of service affecting issues once per month ;
3. Certification of TTY/TDD testing once per month ; and
4. TTY/TDD call logs.

[Include logs necessary to insure compliance with this Agreement, the CSEC/RPC contract, Regional Strategic Plan and individual local requirements.]

Quality Assurance Inspections

RPC personnel will conduct site visits at least 2 times per year to evaluate the condition of equipment, efficiency of PSAP operations, and compliance with the Agreement.

In addition, quality assurance inspections will be conducted as follows:

[List inspections necessary to insure compliance with this Agreement, the CSEC/RPC contract, Regional Strategic Plan and individual local requirements.]

PBRPC staff will monitor 11 PSAPs (2) two times during the fiscal year. If there are findings they will be documented on the 9-1-1 PSAP Monitoring Checklist and will be followed through until the issue has been resolved. A report of the findings or violations will be discussed on site with the PSAP Coordinator and a notification letter will be sent from the 9-1-1 Director to the corresponding PSAP Agency's Chief of Police or Sheriff. PBRPC staff will also notify the PBRPC executive director of any findings. PBRPC will notify CSEC of findings through the quarterly performance reporting.

**A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY OF _____, TEXAS,
APPROVING THE SECOND AMENDMENT
TO THE MEREDITH SUPPLY AGREEMENT**

WHEREAS, in connection with the development and construction of the Sanford Dam and Lake Meredith comprising the "Canadian River Project," the City of _____, Texas (the "City") has entered into that certain Contract dated _____, 1961, as subsequently amended (known as the "Meredith Supply Agreement"), with the Canadian River Municipal Water Authority (the "Authority"), under which the Authority would provide all or part of the City's municipal water supply through the operation and maintenance of the Canadian River Project; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has entered into similar forms of the Meredith Supply Agreement with each of the other cities that are members of the Authority (the "Member Cities"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the terms of the Meredith Supply Agreement, as supplemented by subsequent Prepayment Agreements entered into between the Authority and each of its Member Cities, and pursuant to the financing mechanisms set out in the Meredith Supply Agreement and those Prepayment Agreements, the Authority and the Member Cities have completed the contractual repayment obligation to the United States for the Canadian River Project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Meredith Supply Agreement, following completion of the contractual repayment obligation to the United States for the Canadian River Project the City has a vested right to renew its water supply agreement with the Authority, subject to other water supply availability and financial conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has continued to provide municipal water supply to its Member Cities from the Canadian River Project and other conjunctive use sources, pursuant to the terms of the Meredith Supply Agreement and other existing contracts between the Authority and each of its Member Cities; and

WHEREAS, the Authority and the Member Cities mutually desire to affirm, restate, and extend the term of the original Meredith Supply Agreement, in support of long-term municipal water supply for the Member Cities through the life of the Canadian River Project; and

WHEREAS, by its Resolution No. 01/2021 – 10, dated January 13, 2021, the Authority's Board of Directors has approved the proposed form of a Second Amendment to the Meredith Supply Agreement, to extend the term of that agreement consistent with the Authority's operation and use of the Canadian River Project for the benefit of its Member Cities (the "MSA Second Amendment"), a copy of which form amendment is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has consulted with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation to obtain the Bureau's required prior approval of this MSA Second Amendment; and

WHEREAS, each of the Member Cities has consented to and approved the form of the MSA Second Amendment, as approved by the Board of Directors of the Authority;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF _____, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City approves the terms and conditions of the MSA Second Amendment and authorizes the Mayor to execute the MSA Second Amendment on behalf of the City, to be binding and effective only upon the execution of the same form of MSA Second Amendment by the Authority and each of the other Member Cities.

SECTION 2. The declarations, determinations and findings declared, made and found in the preamble to this Resolution are hereby adopted, restated and made a part of the operative provisions hereof.

SECTION 3. That the City Secretary be and is hereby authorized to deliver a certified copy of this Resolution and minutes pertaining to its adoption to the Secretary of the Canadian River Municipal Water Authority for said Authority's records and proceedings.

SECTION 4. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Resolution has been read, passed and finally adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place and subject matter of the public business to be considered and acted upon at said meeting, including this Resolution, was given, all as required by the applicable provisions of the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code.

**SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE CONTRACT
BETWEEN THE CANADIAN RIVER MUNICIPAL
WATER AUTHORITY AND THE
CITY OF _____, TEXAS**

This Second Amendment is made as of the _____ of _____, 2021, by and between the **CANADIAN RIVER MUNICIPAL WATER AUTHORITY**, a conservation and reclamation district duly created and existing under the laws of the State of Texas (the "Authority") and the **CITY OF _____**, a home rule city and municipal corporation in the State of Texas acting under authority of its city charter and the laws of the State of Texas (the "City").

RECITALS:

1. The Authority and the City entered into a contract dated January 9, 1961, as previously supplemented and amended (known as the "Meredith Supply Agreement"), under which the Authority would provide all or part of the City's municipal water supply through the operation and maintenance of the Sanford Dam and Lake Meredith (the "Canadian River Project"), based on the City's status as a "Member City" of the Authority and under terms substantially identical in form and substance to the contemporaneous agreements for municipal water supply entered into by the Authority with each of its other Member Cities.

2. The Authority and the City later entered into an agreement dated February 16, 1999, for the prepayment of the obligations to the United States of America incurred in connection with the construction of the Canadian River Project (the "Prepayment Agreement"), which is expressly formulated as a supplement to the Meredith Supply Agreement, and under terms substantially identical in form and substance to the contemporaneous Prepayment Agreements entered into by the Authority with each of its other Member Cities.

3. Under its terms, the Meredith Supply Agreement remains effective until the federal construction repayment obligation for the Canadian River Project is paid in full, with the City (like all the Authority's Member Cities) thereafter having a vested right to renew its municipal water supply agreement with the Authority for the life of the Canadian River Project.

4. By and through the Prepayment Agreements and the underlying financing for which they provide, the federal construction repayment obligation for the Canadian River Project has been satisfied in full by the Authority and its Member Cities, and the Authority continues to operate and maintain the Canadian River Project, which provides a source of municipal water supply as agreed under the Meredith Supply Agreement.

5. The Authority and the City mutually desire to affirm, restate, and extend the term of the Meredith Supply Agreement, as provided for therein, and thereby to facilitate the long-term municipal water supply of the City, in connection with the parties' other existing contractual arrangements.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants stated in this Second Amendment, and for other good and valuable consideration, the City and the Authority hereby further amend the Meredith Supply Agreement as follows:

1. Article 19 of the Meredith Supply Agreement, captioned "Term of Contract," is hereby amended by deleting the second sentence of that article and replacing it with the following sentence, to renew and extend the term of that agreement for the life of the Canadian River Project:

Following the full payment of the Authority's construction repayment obligation for the Canadian River Project, and based on the City's then vested right to renew this contract, the City and the Authority agree that the term of this contract is renewed and extended, beginning on the Effective Date of the Second Amendment to this contract and continuing to the date that the Project is terminated or abandoned by the Authority. The Project shall not be deemed terminated or abandoned by the Authority unless the Board has finally terminated, with no intention to resume, operation or maintenance of the Project or any part thereof, and has notified the Member Cities that the Authority has no further financial, maintenance, operational or other material obligations with respect to the Project or with respect to any Revenue Bonds.

Termination of Project

If the Project is terminated or abandoned, the City shall continue to pay timely to the Authority the City's portion of the Project Operation and Maintenance costs incurred by the Authority or obligated to be paid by the Authority to meet its obligations and to otherwise fulfill its obligations and liabilities with respect to the Project, including without limitation, any obligations under any Revenue Bonds.

The Project may not be terminated unless written notice is given to each Member City thirty (30) days prior to a meeting of the Board of the Authority when the issue of termination of the Project is on the agenda, and all of the Members of the Board who are present and voting vote to terminate the Project.

2. Except as expressly amended by this Second Amendment, the Meredith Supply Agreement, except for any of its provisions which have been completely satisfied or superseded by other agreements executed by the parties, remains valid and effective, and this Second Amendment shall not be construed to amend or affect the validity of the Prepayment Agreement or any other existing contracts by and between the Authority and the City.

3. Notwithstanding the Effective Date stated below, this Second Amendment shall not become effective until a similar amendment agreement has been executed by the Authority and each of the other Member Cities, to amend their respective Meredith Supply Agreements.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto, acting under authority of their respective governing bodies, and with the prior approval of a duly authorized representative of the United

States, have caused this Second Amendment to be duly executed in several counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original, all as of the day and year first above written.

WHEREAS, The Consultant has gained a great amount of experience in the groundwater and wastewater treatment and has acquired a vast knowledge of the affairs of the water treatment processing industry; and has and continues to serve as a Consultant for other organizations.

WHEREAS, Consultant has a valid class "B" Ground Water Treatment Operator issued by Texas Commission On Environment Quality

WHEREAS, Consultant is not an employee of the CITY OF LAMESA.

WHEREAS, the City desires an association with the Consultant, to secure the benefit of his services, experience, reputation, and associations in the industry, and his knowledge of the business affairs of the treatment of ground and wastewater and to provide the consultant with an incentive for his valued service in the form of remuneration and other consideration; and the Consultant desires to accept such assignment and remuneration, all of the terms and conditions hereof.

CONSULTING SERVICES

- A. The City hereby retains the services of the Consultant in an advisory and consultative capacity (Consulting Services) effective on the Commencement Date. The Consultant hereby accepts such assignment, in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth.**
- B. The Consultant will render Consulting Services to the City and serve in a consulting capacity with members of the City, as the City may reasonably request. The Consultant agrees to devote on a part-time basis attention that is reasonably requested of him by**

**INTERLOCAL GOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION CONTRACT
FOR ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES**

**STATE OF TEXAS
City of Lamesa**

AGREEMENT:

This Agreement is made and entered into this ____ day of _____ by and between the City of Lamesa, Texas, hereinafter referred to as "City", and the Permian Basin Regional Planning Commission, hereinafter referred to as "PBRPC", a political subdivision under Chapter 391 of the Texas Local Government Code, acting by and through its duly authorized executive officer.

WHEREAS, both "City" and "PBRPC" are local governments as defined by Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, and this contract is made and executed under provisions of said chapter, which is commonly known as the Interlocal Cooperation Act; and,

WHEREAS, PBRPC has professional administrative services expertise useful to the City of Lamesa and desires to make such services available under the following terms and conditions;

NOW, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

PBRPC agrees to provide certain administrative services, as described in Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of this agreement, for the City of Lamesa, pursuant to the receipt by the City of Public Works and Economic Adjustment Assistance (PWEAA) Program contract from the United States Department of Commerce. In consideration for administrative services described herein, the City agrees to pay PBRPC as described in Section 8 of this agreement.

SCOPE OF WORK:

SECTION 1. PROGRAM SET-UP

- 1.01 Provide general advice with respect to the implementation of the project and regulatory matters.
- 1.02 Furnish necessary forms and procedures for grant administration implementation of the project.
- 1.03 Provide technical assistance for the routine tasks to City personnel who will be directly involved in the program.
- 1.04 Assist the City in developing a record keeping system consistent with program guidelines, including the establishment and maintenance of program files.
- 1.05 Serve as liaison for the City during any monitoring visits by staff representatives of the United States Department of Commerce (granting agency).
- 1.06 Assist the City in meeting all special condition requirements commencing with grant announcement and through the end of grant reporting period.

- 1.07 Prepare and submit to United States Department of Commerce all required periodic progress reports and compliance reports.
- 1.08 Assist the City in meeting citizen participation requirements, civil rights and personnel requirements which may be qualifying factors for participation in the Public Works and Economic Adjustment Assistance (grant program).

SECTION 2. FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

- 2.01 Assist the City in documenting its ability to manage grant funds as required by the state/federal grant agency.
- 2.02 Assist the City in establishing and maintaining separate journals, and ledgers as necessary for this project.
- 2.03 Assist the City in submitting the required depository and signature forms to United States Department of Commerce.
- 2.04 Assist the City in preparation and submission of requests for payment of funds by contractors.
- 2.05 Assist the City in establishing procedures to handle the use of any PWEAA program income.

SECTION 3. ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

- 3.01 Coordinate submission of the environmental assessment of the project to funding agency.
- 3.02 Maintain reporting required for environmental clearance procedures with state and local officials and other interested parties.
- 3.04 Prepare files of any required environmental reassessment reports for submission.
- 3.05 Prepare request for release of funds and certifications.

SECTION 4. ACQUISITION

- 4.01 Maintain files and documented reports required for acquisitions, if any, on behalf of the City.
- 4.02 Assist the City in determining the necessary documentation of ownership of City-owned real estate, rights-of-way, easements, or other real property rights, if any, which may be required by the United States Department of Commerce.
- 4.04 Maintain separate files for each parcel of real property acquired.

SECTION 5. LABOR STANDARDS

- 5.01 Assist the City in determining how much, if any, of the United States Department of Commerce contract activities will be carried out, in whole or part, by force account labor.

- 5.02 Assist the City in determining the necessity for hiring any temporary employees to carry out United States Department of Commerce contract activities to meet the requirements of the grant.
- 5.03 Assist the City in maintaining adequate documentation of personnel, equipment, and materials used in the project and of related costs to meet grant requirements.
- 5.04 Assist the City in documenting compliance with federal and state requirements for equal employment opportunity.
- 5.05 Assist the City in documenting compliance with minimum wage and overtime requirements.
- 5.06 Act as local labor standards officer, when needed.
- 5.07 Request wage rates from state, when necessary.
- 5.08 Obtain state verifications of construction contractor eligibility.
- 5.09 Submit Notice of Start of Construction, Notice to Proceed, Final Wage Compliance Report and other applicable labor standards reports.
- 5.10 Attend pre-construction conference and prepare minutes (as needed).
- 5.11 Review weekly contractor payrolls and conduct compliance activities.
- 5.12 Conduct construction employee interviews.
- 5.13 Maintain monthly employee utilization reports as required.

SECTION 6. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

- 6.01 Assist the City in developing, implementing and documenting EEO compliance activities.
- 6.02 Maintain documentation of project beneficiaries as required.
- 6.03 Prepare work write-ups and cost estimates, when appropriate.
- 6.04 Conduct inspections and process final contract documents as required.

SECTION 7. PROJECT AUDIT/CLOSE-OUT

- 7.01 Prepare Project Compliance reporting applicable closeout.
- 7.02 Assist the City in responding to any monitoring findings in connection with inspections and project reviews by the internal city departments and associated funding agency audit and monitoring agencies.
- 7.03 Assist the City in resolving any third-party claims.
- 7.04 Provide the City's auditor with funding agency audit guidelines when needed.

7.05 PBRPC shall not be financially responsible for any audit findings or for payment for an audit.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE:

SECTION 8. PAYMENT SCHEDULE

8.01 The City of Lamesa agrees to pay PBRPC a five percent (5%) of total grant fee under the following schedule:

1)	Establishment of Record Keeping System	22.5%
2)	Completion of Environmental Compliance Reporting	22.5%
3)	Completion of Bid/Contract Award Process	22.5%
4)	Labor Standards Compliance/Completion of Construction	22.5%
5)	Filing of all Required Closeout Information	10%
	TOTAL	100%

8.02 The PBRPC shall receive funds from the United States Department of Commerce pertaining to this project and shall be responsible for the deposit, disbursement, and management of such funds.

8.03 Funds awarded to PBRPC by the City of Lamesa under the terms of this agreement are authorized under the provisions of the State of Texas Professional Services Procurement Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 2254, Subchapter A, "Professional Services".

TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

SECTION 9. ADDITIONAL PBRPC OBLIGATIONS

9.01 During the performance of this agreement, PBRPC agrees as follows:

- A. PBRPC will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of national origin, religion, race, creed, sex, familial status, or gender. PBRPC will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and during the course of employment, are treated without regard to national origin, race, religion, creed, sex, familial status or gender. The actions will include, but are not necessarily limited to, employment up-grading, promotion, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. PBRPC will remain compliant with accommodations for Limited English Speaking individuals.
- B. When soliciting or advertising for employees, PBRPC will clearly state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, creed, sex, or national origin.

- C. PBRPC will furnish all information and reports of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to its books, accounts, and records by the City of Lamesa and the Secretary of Labor for the purposes of investigation to ascertain with such rules, regulations and orders.
- D. If the Secretary of Labor determines that PBRPC does not comply with rules, regulations, or orders issued by the Secretary, this agreement may be cancelled, terminated or suspended, in whole or in part, and PBRPC may be declared ineligible for further participation in government contracts under provisions of Executive Order #11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rules otherwise provided by law.

SECTION 10. CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964.

10.01 During the performance of this Agreement, PBRPC agrees to the following:

Under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, no person shall, on the grounds of national origin, race, religion, creed, sex, familial status, or gender, be excluded from participation in, be denied benefits of, or be subjected to, discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance.

SECTION 11. PERIOD OF AGREEMENT, AGREEMENT TERMINATION, CONTRACT REPRESENTATIVE, AND PROCEDURE FOR AMENDING

- 11.01 Both parties agree that it is intended that all performances under this agreement are to be accomplished within two years of the date of its execution unless amended by mutual agreement of the parties. In any event, it is agreed and understood that PBRPC shall be paid for performance rendered under this agreement.
- 11.02 This agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days' notice in writing by one party to the other. Upon such termination, if any, PBRPC shall be paid any outstanding sums due PBRPC within thirty (30) days of termination.
- 11.03 It is further understood and agreed by the parties that PBRPC is not responsible or liable to third parties for performance or non-performance by the City of Lamesa under terms of this agreement as allowed by the laws and constitution of the State of Texas.
- 11.04 PBRPC designates as its Contract Representative with the City of Lamesa, its Executive Director. All communications relating to this Agreement should be addressed and directed to the Executive Director, or to a designee expressly named by the Executive Director.
- 11.05 It is understood and agreed by the parties, that each is contracting independently; and that nothing contained herein shall be construed as giving rise to or creating partnership, joint venture, or employer/employee relationship.

- 11.06 It is further understood and agreed, by all parties, that should either party breach the terms of this Agreement, the only remedy shall be termination of the Agreement in accordance with provisions of Section 12 of this Agreement.
- 11.07 Either party may, from time to time, request changes in the scope of the services to be performed. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of compensation to PBRPC, shall be mutually agreed upon by both parties and shall be incorporated herein by a written amendment to this Contract.

SECTION 12. INTEREST OF THE PARTIES

- 12.01 No member of the governing body of the City of Lamesa and no other officer, employee, agent, or public official, who exercises any function or responsibility in connection with the planning or completion of the water improvement project has or shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect, in this contract or the work performed thereunder.
- 12.02 PBRPC covenants that neither it nor any of its officers, directors, employees or agents has any financial interest in the project. PBRPC further covenants that neither it nor any of its officers, directors, employees or agents shall acquire any interest, either direct or indirect, in the study area or any parcel therein, or any other interest which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of its services hereunder. PBRPC further covenants that no person having any conflicting interest shall be employed for performance of its services under terms of this Agreement.
- 12.03 No person who is an employee, agent, officer, or official of PBRPC who exercises or have exercised any functions or responsibilities with respect to the activities assisted under this contract who are in a position to participate in a decision making process or gain inside information with regard to such activities, may obtain a financial interest or benefit from the activity, have an interest in or benefit from the activity or have any interest in any contract, subcontract or agreement with respect to the activities or the proceeds either for themselves or those with whom they have family or business ties during their tenure or for one year thereafter.
- 12.04 Local Program Liaison: The City of Lamesa has designated the City Manager to be the primary contact for PBRPC in all matters concerning this grant and interlocal agreement.

SECTION 13. MISCELLANEOUS

- 13.01 PBRPC shall give the United States Department of Commerce ,the Inspector General of the U.S., the Comptroller of the Currency, the Comptroller General of the United States, the Auditor of the State of Texas, or the General Accounting Office or any of their duly authorized representatives, access to and the right to examine all books, accounts, records, reports, files, other papers, things, or property belonging to or in use by PBRPC pertaining to this contract and the resulting project. Such rights to access shall continue as long as the records are retained by PBRPC. PBRPC agrees to maintain such records in an

accessible location and to provide reasonable access to such records consistent with the Texas Public Information Act.

- 13.02 The party's signatory on behalf of PBRPC and on behalf of the City of Lamesa, respectively, do individually hereby certify that each is authorized to execute this agreement on behalf of each respective organization.
- 13.03 This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relating to the rights granted and the responsibilities assumed.
- 13.04 Should any deviation occur from any of the requirements of this Agreement or the PWEAA Grant contract, known to PBRPC, or which becomes known to PBRPC, then PBRPC shall immediately inform the City of Lamesa in writing.
- 13.05 PBRPC shall maintain fiscal records and supporting documentation for all expenditures of contract funds pursuant to OMB Circular A-87, CFR 2. PBRPC shall retain these records and supporting documentation for the greater of three years from completion of this project.
- 13.6 PBRPC and the City of Lamesa will work along with funding agency and other parties to the grant (Example: Engineer, contractor, material supplier, regulatory agency, etc). to ensure that compliance is achieved in all areas of this grant. Should issues of non-compliance arise, the City of Lamesa and PBRPC will work towards reasonable solutions.
- 13.7 Percentage Share of Negligence. To the fullest extent permitted by law, a party's total liability to the other party and anyone claiming by, through, or under the other party for any cost, loss, or damage caused in part by the negligence of the party and in part by the negligence of the other party or any other negligent entity or individual, shall not exceed the percentage share that the party's negligence bears to the total negligence of the City of, PBRPC, and all other negligent entities and individuals.
- 13.8 Mutual Waiver. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the City of Lamesa and PBRPC waive against each other, and the other's employees, officers, directors, agents, insurers, partners, and consultants, any and all claims for or entitlement to special, incidental, indirect, or consequential damages arising out of, resulting from, or in any way related to the Project.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lamesa, Texas, has adopted a Substandard Structure Ordinance establishing procedures and policies requiring the repair, demolition or removal of certain structures, which have been deemed to be a public nuisance; and

That a copy or resolution be served on the owners of such property in the manner and form provided in the Substandard Structure Ordinance.

That this resolution shall take effect immediately.

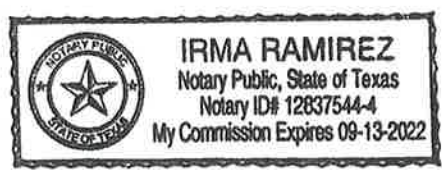

VIOLATION: Ordinance O-5-18 Substandard Structures

VACANT STRUCTURES AND LAND: All vacant structures and premises thereof or vacant land shall be maintained in a clean, safe, secure and sanitary condition as provided herein so as not to cause a blighting problem or adversely affect the public health and safety.

Comments: STRUCTURE IS VACANT, SERVE SIGNS OF DETERIORATION AND LACK OF UPKEEP TO STRUCTURE. OVERALL CONDITIONS ARE CAUSING AN ADVERSE AFFECT TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY.

OVERHANG EXTENSIONS: All overhang extensions including, but not limited to canopies, marquees, signs, metal awnings, fire escapes, standpipes, and exhaust ducts shall be maintained in good repair and be properly anchored so as to be kept in sound condition. When required, all exposed surfaces of metal or wood shall be protected for the elements and against decay or rust by periodic application of weather-coating materials, such as paint or similar surface treatment.

Comments: PORCH, OVERHANGS AND EAVES ARE SEVERELY WATER DAMAGED DUE TO THE LACK OF PAINT AND MAINTENANCE. IN SOME PLACES BEAMS HAVEN FALLEN. ABOVE DOOR FROM EAVE TO DOOR WOOD IS COMPLETELY GONE AND OPEN TO OUTSIDE IN AREAS.

ROOFS AND DRAINAGE: The roof and flashing shall be sound, tight and not have defects that admit rain. Roof drainage shall be adequate to prevent dampness or deterioration in the walls or interior portion of the structure. Roof drains, gutters and downspouts shall be maintained in good repair and free from obstruction. Roof water shall not be discharged in a matter that creates a public nuisance.

Comments: ROOF DAMAGE MOST LIKELY CAUSING WATER LEAKAGE INSIDE THE STRUCTURE

WINDOWS, SKYLIGHT & DOORS FRAMES: Every window, skylight, door and frame shall be kept in sound condition, good repair and weather tight.

Comments: SOME WINDOWS ARE BROKEN OUT WINDOW IS COVERED BY BOARDS; THE MAJORITY OF THE WINDOWS ARE LACKING WINDOW SCREENS NEEDED TO PREVENT INSECTS FOR ACCESSING THE STRUCTURE.

GENERAL: The interior of a structure and equipment therein shall be maintained in good repair, structurally sound and in a sanitary condition. Occupants shall keep that part of the structure which they occupy or control in a clean and sanitary condition. Every owner of a structure containing a rooming house, shall maintain, in a clean and sanitary condition, the shared or public areas of the structure and exterior property.

Comments: THE OVERALL CONDITIONS OF THE STRUCTURES ON THE PROPERTY ARE SEVERE.

EXTERIOR SURFACES: All exterior surfaces, including windows and doors, shall be maintained in good, clean and sanitary condition. Peeling, chipping, flaking, or abraded paint shall be repaired, removed, or covered. Cracked or loose plaster, decayed wood, and other defective surface conditions shall be corrected.

Comments THE PROPERTY IS OPEN AND ACCESSIBLE TO THE PUBLIC WHICH LEAVES OPPORTUNITY FOR VANDALISM. WOOD IS CRACKED AND PEELING, WITH LARGE AMOUNTS OF DECAYED WOOD.

ACCUMULATION OF RUBBISH AND GARBAGE: All exterior property and premises, and the interior of every structure, shall be free from any accumulation of rubbish or garbage.

Comments: RUBBISH AND DEBRIS THROUGHOUT THE PROPERTY.

RODENT HARBORAGE: All Structures and exterior property shall be kept free from rodent harborage and infestation. Where rodents are found, they shall be promptly exterminated by approved processes which will not be injurious to human health. After extermination, proper precautions shall be taken to eliminate rodent harborage and re-infestation.

Comments: POSSIBLE RODENT HARBORAGE

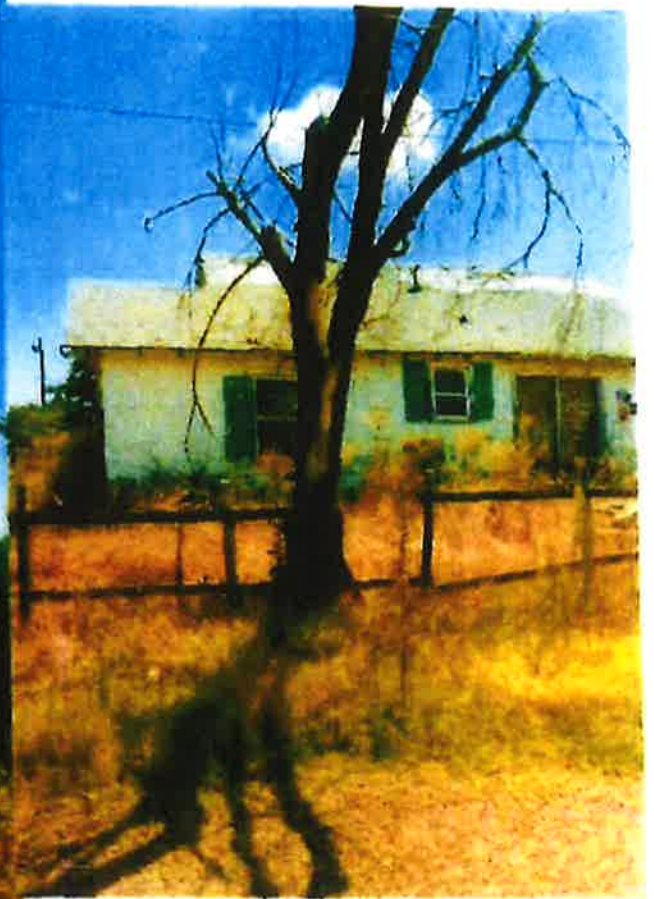
